Notification of BRR detection





I am Suqi with PEI Department of Agriculture.

This letter is to inform you that one of your potato lots has been identified as infected with Bacteria Ring Rot (BRR).

Pursuant to the PEI Plant Health Act, a disposal plan must be submitted within 14 days or sooner in accordance with the provided instruction of Identification of Information for disposal plan. A representative from the province will be in touch with you to address any questions you may have regarding the development of a disposal plan.

I am Dr. Suqi Liu with PEI Department of Agriculture.

This letter is to inform you that one or more of your potato lots are associated with a seed potato parent lot that has been identified as infected with Bacteria Ring Rot (BRR).

Following the notification, the Department of Agriculture would proceed with sample collection and BRR testing for relevant potato lots, if available.

MINISTER'S ORDER

for

Bacterial Ring Rot Disposal and Clean-up Notice



WHEREAS based upon a report from the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) I have reason to believe that your 2024 potato crop constitutes a hazard by reason that it is infected with a regulated disease or causal pathogen, namely, Bacterial Ring Rot (*Clavibacter michiganense subsp. sepedonicum*),

AND WHEREAS, based upon this report, your entire 2024 potato crop, farm premises, buildings and equipment are considered contaminated and the following shall apply to your farm unit(s),

Minister's Order for BRR Disposal and Clean-up Notice

- A Disposal Plan must be prepared within 14 days or less.
 Dispose of, or cause to be disposed of entire 2024 potato crop.
 - Displacement of production
 - Burial or dehydration of cull potatoes and waste.
- 3. Clean up and disinfect or cause to be cleaned up and disinfected farm unit and premises.
- 4. No crops may be transported to, from, or within infected farm until the affected potato crop is disposed of and the premises are cleaned and disinfected.

BRR Disposal Plan

1. Farm Information:

Farm name, grower name, grower No., address, contact info;

Variety Info: name, class, certification #, field location, size.

Infected field info; Storage location with diagram; Location of disposal site.

BRR Disposal Plan (cont.)

- 2. Biosecurity measures: such as using a footbath and/or pressurized sprayer to disinfect footwear.
- 3. Transportation related information:
 - Identify the location, transporter, and receiver of potatoes.
 - Describe measures to ensure that trucks do not stop at any other farm on PEI after leaving your place.
 - Outline strategies to minimize the risk of potatoes falling onto public highways.
 - Provide instructions on cleaning and disinfecting vehicles and equipment.

BRR Disposal Plan (cont.)


4. Clean-up and Disinfection Plan for Infrastructure

- Describe the process and timing for cleaning and disinfecting storage, grading, holding, loading and shipping area;
- Explain the steps and schedule for thoroughly cleaning storage facilities, equipment, and materials to remove all soil and organic matter before applying disinfectant.

BRR Disposal Plan (cont.)

5. Documentation

- Detail how the movement and destination of loads shipped from farm will be tracked;
- Outline the process for tracking and logging disinfection activities;
- Specify the projected completion date for cleanup and disinfection.




Volunteer Free Monitoring

Plant Health Act Potatoes Regulations 10 (3): Clearance of infected area:

Potatoes shall not be planted, or allowed to be planted, in a field where there has been an occurrence of bacterial ring rot unless the grower is able to verify, to an inspector, that the field has been free of potatoes, including volunteers, for the previous two years.

Potato crops can be planted in BRR infected fields only if no volunteer potatoes are detected for two consecutive years.



PEI Plant Health Act Potatoes Regulations:

12. Permit for extra- provincial seed

No person shall plant any seed potato originating outside the province unless that person has obtained a permit to import and plant potato seed from the Minister. *(EC138/95)*

Planting Permits for Seed Potatoes Originating From Outside the Province: Guidelines for Planting

The guidelines are issued in addition to the policy document "Import Requirements for Seed Potatoes and Other Potato Propagative Material;" directive D-98-01 (9th revision), administered by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA).

_

- The planting of seed potatoes grown on farm units located outside the province of Prince Edward Island is regulated to **prevent the entry of regulated diseases and their causal pathogens**.

Criteria (from outside of PEI):

- 1. BRR Testing negative;
- 2. PVY and PLRV post-harvest testing: PLRV ≤2% PVY + PLRV ≤3%
- 3. CFIA Bulk Movement Certificate/Record of Bulk Movement or Certificate of Authorization. Tags are required for potato seed received in bags.
- 4. Trucks should be cleaned and disinfected BEFORE loading.

Additional Criteria (from USA):

- 1. Each seed lot shall be identified by a State Certification Program lot number or identifier recognized by CFIA;
- 2. Each Seed lot shall be assigned a seed potato classification equivalency by CFIA.
- 3. Farm unit should be free from BRR infection.
- 4. Have a valid Import Permit issued by CFIA and a current North American Seed Potato Health Certificate issued by relevant state potato certification agency.
